



RTMC Plans To Spend over \$11 million in Fiber Upgrades

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August 10, 2013 – Asheboro, N.C. – Hundreds of people turned out for Randolph Telephone Membership Corporation's 55th Annual Meeting on August 10. Talented singer and Asheboro native Alyssa Lowe regaled the crowd with her rendition of the National Anthem before introducing the Southwestern Randolph High School JROTC Color Guard.

Prizes were awarded for the oldest male and female members in attendance along with more than 100 door prizes were randomly drawn. Special gifts for each attending member were given out and children enjoyed a number of games with prizes.
